Its purpose is to close the gap between job seeker skills and business needs, and its mission is to leverage public and private resources to produce skilled workers for a competitive regional economy in 37 municipalities within North Central CT.

Adult Career Services

CWP oversees the operation of four in the regional American Job Centers in partnership with the State Dept. of Labor and other state agencies. These centers provide job seekers with a full array of career services.
